



2025 Call for Proposals Research, Development, and Innovation

Overview



- The WRC fulfils its mandate by prioritising water research that addresses the needs of the water sector and its stakeholders.
- The RDI agenda tackles water security and socio-economic challenges in South Africa while driving an innovation-led water and sanitation sector.
- Five thematic areas guide the generation of new knowledge, the development of innovations, and capacity building:
 - 1. Water availability
 - 2. Water use
 - 3. Water quality and health
 - 4. Water advisory support
 - 5. Knowledge services

This call for research proposals aims to address national challenges through research, development, and innovation, enabling the WRC to enhance water security while promoting adaptation and resilience to climate change.

Strategic priorities



- The WRC's strategy is anchored on the following priority outcomes:
 - **1. An <u>innovative water sector</u>** that leverages research, technology, and innovation to address challenges.
 - **2. An <u>informed and engaged society</u>** that is empowered with knowledge and actively takes part in water-related decision-making.
 - **3.** A <u>transformed water sector</u> that is inclusive, equitable, and reflective of South Africa's developmental goals.
 - **4.** An <u>agile and adaptive organisation</u> that effectively responds to emerging challenges and opportunities in the water sector.

Challenges




- Failing water service delivery at the local level.
